Many members from the Irish Sea Branch attended.</p> <p>Social events included the early season supper in Caernarfon at the Royal Welsh Yacht Club. A super venue where we were taken up the flag turret to the roof and admired the stunning views down the Menai Strait. <p>10.0</p>	<p>AOB</p> <p>Dave invited MOA Member, Mark Godwin, <i>RYA Principal and Chief Instructor</i> at North Wales Cruising Club, to tell us about his role and the training courses available.</p> <p>Mark introduced himself and his background and the NWCC club location in Conwy.</p> <p>Information on future courses is available on the website and Mark also handed out a flyer with dates of forthcoming Day Skipper/Yacht Master theory. http://nwcc.info/training/</p> <p>Courses are provided at a reasonable cost and not profit driven. Cheaper than other local providers. Courses are available to non-members.</p> <p>Mark mentioned that he is planning to offer ICC assessments later in the year, for those sailors chartering abroad. Mark may also offer the RYA course 'Essential Navigation and Seamanship. This is a valuable theory course for sailing partners who may not want/need to do Day Skipper</p> <p>Mark can provide practical assessment on owners' own boats.</p> <p>Mark is keen to get involved with members individually or in groups to support any training needs.</p> <p>Irene Campbell put forward a suggestion for refresher courses/ sessions to update those sailors who had undertaken courses and had the certificates, but felt they would benefit from a recap on prior learning. An interesting discussion followed and it was apparent that this type of event/training could be well attended.</p> <p>Mark commented that he would look further into this but also asked the member to contact him with their suggestions.</p> <p>Prior to closing the meeting, Dave asked Paul Kennedy to say a few words.</p> <p>Paul thanked Dave Kitchen, Sally Ousbey, Barbara Weeks and the committee for their hard work and active participation.</p> <p>He thanked the branch for inviting him and Ann to join us at our AGM and lunch.</p> <p>He commented that our branch was one of the best supported comparing the % of numbers attending events to the total number of members in the branch.
